Series Awards via 'Series Entry' ONLY

Series Participation Awards will be presented to ALL riders in Mini-Wheelers, Sprockets, Challenge classes, Cruiser classes and Superclass classes who enter via the "Series Entry" option ONLY (entering all 3 rounds individually does not constitute a series entry and you will not receive the Series Participation Award).

THIS IS A TRANSPONDER SCORED EVENT

All riders (excluding Mini Wheelers and Sprockets) must have a transponder to register and be scored at these events.

As per the AusCycling regulations, it is the responsibility of the rider/parent to ensure that each transponder is working correctly and fixed to each bike correctly. Also, that it has a current Mylaps subscription and sufficient battery level.

In the event of a malfunction of the timing system or malfunction or loss of transponder, for any reason, the rider's finishing position will be determined by the officials.

Any rider coming off the gate without a transponder or with a non-working transponder will be scored as DNF and may be disqualified.

If a rider's timing hill signal is detected, but not a finish signal, the officials will use best endeavours to determine the placing for that rider. If this is not possible the rider will be scored last.

Transponders can be purchased and renewed at our.sqorz.com. A transponder must be purchased and activated PRIOR to registering for any or all of the rounds of this series.

Only a limited amount of transponders are available for hire which will be at a \$10.00 fee. To hire a transponder, you will need to purchase this through Entryboss when entering the event.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. AusCycling Technical Regulations - General and Technical Regulations - BMX Race rules apply plus the following special conditions of entry.

2. 3 riders constitutes a class.

3. The Twilight Series 2022 events are a series of 3 race meetings. These events are designated as Category R (Bronze) level.

4. All meetings are pre-entry meetings ONLY

5. All riders must confirm their registration on the day of racing.

- All Challenge, Cruiser and Superclass, riders must register using their transponder via the transponder check-in station at registration. Riders/parents must ensure that the information displayed on the check-in station display screen is correct, and notify a registration official if there is an error, before registration closes.
- All Participation classes (Mini-wheelers, Sprockets) must scan their licenses at the Registration Box.
- It is the rider's/parents responsibility to check that the rider's entry details are correct, and notify the club if changes are required.

6. No refunds will be provided without a medical certificate.

7. Meeting formats - 4 motos and 5th moto/finals – Deadman finals for semis/quarters etc. Invitational Finals for all Challenge Classes, Cruisers and Superclass

8. Challenge Class series awards:

- All riders of Mini-Wheelers, Sprockets, Challenge classes, Cruiser classes, Superclass classes who enter via the "Series Entry" option will receive a Series Participation Award at the end of Round 3 **.(entering all 3 rounds individually does not constitute a series entry).**
- Riders will be automatically scored in the class they enter. Where classes are merged due to low entry numbers, riders will be scored for the series in the class which they entered (not the merged class). Superclass Riders will not be merged. If there are not enough Superclass Riders to consist of a class, this class will be Scratched.
- 1st, 2nd and 3rd for all competitive classes will receive the Series Participation Award along with a Podium Award for the overall winners.

Superclass Prize Pool is \$1500.00 per Round. The Prize pool will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd Only. If you Enter via the “Series Entry” you will also receive a Series Participation Award at the end of round 3 along with a Podium Award for the overall winners. Please also note that if there are not enough entries for eg, ‘Women’s Superclass ‘ in the First round, this class will not be available for the remainder of the rounds.

9. If you Enter via the Series Entry and do not make a round, you will still be eligible for the Series Participation Award. Your points will be carried over.

10. Once the first round is completed, the race classes will be set for the remainder of the rounds. If you enter round 2 or 3 separately and your class is not available, you will be entered in your next aged group.

11. This is a Covid safe event. All attendees must abide by the regulations and sign in using the “Check in Tas” app.

EVENT TIMELINE

****All riders must be registered and be confirmed before commencing practice or racing !****

Registration opens at 3pm and closes at 4:30pm

Practice:

- 3:30pm – 3:45pm 8-12year old – all bike types
- 3:45pm – 4:00pm 13-16 year old – all bike types
- 4:00pm – 4:15pm 17+years – all bike types
- 4:15pm – 4:30pm Superclass (jnr & snr)
- 4:30pm – 4:45 pm Sprockets
- 4.45pm – 5.00 pm Mini Wheelers

- Officials Briefing 5:00pm– 5:10pm
- Riders Briefing 5:10pm – 5.20pm
- Racing Commences 5:30pm

Race Format and Times are subject to change. This technical guide is your point of reference for the event, racing format and times.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Racing conducted under Auscycling Technical Regulations: A protest may be filed by a rider through the Team Manager (Riders Advocate) with the Chief Commissaire for the scoring of a rider. Protests can only be made on the results from the scoring medium showing the order in which the riders crossed the finish line, not the decisions of the commissaires panel that are noted in the results such as DNS (Did Not Start), DNF (Did Not Finish), REL (Relegated).

In all cases the decisions made by the Chief Commissaire are final and cannot be protested.

All riders are responsible to use equipment/clothing that complies with the AusCycling Technical Regulations: BMX 2022 for practice and racing. Number plates must be used during practice and racing.

The fact that any non-compliance was not noticed earlier in an event or a previous event shall not constitute a defense.
